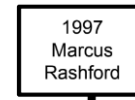
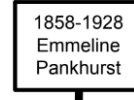

Did Marcus Rashford ever meet Emmeline Pankhurst?

How have they changed our world for the better?

Emmeline Pankhurst led the Suffragettes, and in 1928 all woman over the age of 21 were allowed to vote the same as men.

Marcus Rashford spoke out and campaigned for free school meals for children in need, even when schools were closed.

Emmeline Pankhurst

- Emmeline was born in Manchester, England.
- She started to fight for woman to be allowed to vote for when she was 14 years old.
- She led a group of woman called the Suffragettes who argued that women should be allowed to vote.
- Because of her actions, eventually the law was changed so women could vote and stand for election.



Marcus Rashford

- Marcus was born in Manchester in 1997.
- Growing up, he experienced child poverty despite his mother's hard work, there was sometimes not enough food to go around.
- The family often turned to food banks and free school meals.
- He plays football for Manchester United and England national teams.
- He campaigns on issues of child food poverty and literacy in the UK. Rashford was awarded a MBE from Prince William for his charity work.
