

Artificial intelligence (AI)

Generative artificial intelligence (AI) tools are now widespread and easy to access. Staff, pupils and parents/carers may be familiar with generative chatbots such as ChatGPT and Google Bard. Broughton Jewish Cassel Fox Primary School recognises that AI has many uses, including enhancing teaching and learning.

However, AI may also have the potential to facilitate abuse (e.g. bullying and grooming) and/or expose pupils to harmful content. For example, in the form of 'deepfakes', where AI is used to create images, audio or video hoaxes that look real. In the interest of safeguarding, Broughton Jewish Cassel Fox Primary School will treat any use of AI to access harmful content or bully pupils in line with this policy and our behaviour and anti bullying policy. In regards to staff use of AI, all staff **have been made aware** of the risks of using AI tools whilst they are still being developed and should carry out risk assessments for any new AI tool being used by the school, consulting with the computing lead if they have any concerns. Any use of AI to improve teacher workload will be conducted through the lens of our GDPR policy and no identifying factors will be used.

As the use of AI in the educational sector evolves, this policy will be updated.
